

Procedure to Ensure Nondiscrimination and Equal Opportunity

The Office of the State Fire Marshal is committed to providing programs and services that are free from discrimination. Individuals may request reasonable modifications from the Office of the State Fire Marshal that they believe will enable them to have such equal opportunity to participate in our programs, activities, and services.

The Office of the State Fire Marshal may contact you to obtain more information about your request and to better understand your needs. In addition, the Office of the State Fire Marshal may review your request to determine whether the requested modification will be effective in allowing you to participate in the activity or program in which you are seeking participation; whether the requested modification is reasonable, or an equally effective alternative to the requested modification is available; and whether providing you with the requested modification would fundamentally alter the nature of the program or impose undue financial or administrative burdens on the Office of the State Fire Marshal.
